Courses are also available for Act 48 and Level II Certification to help teachers meet professional development standards and licensure requirements.



GOALS

Upon completion of the M.Ed., students will demonstrate the ability to:

- Describe changes in personal teaching practices as a result of acquisition and application of new skills and knowledge
- Understand the diversity of learner needs in a learner centered classroom
- Interpret research on effective teaching and learning practices and how that research translates to the educational setting
- Effect changes in teaching practices as a result of acquisition and application of new skills and knowledge
- Evaluate learner needs and select appropriate instructional assessment approach
